



Museum of Drunk History to Open in LA

Comedy Central's liquored-up narration of our nation's past is getting it's own exhibit, as The Museum of Drunk History opens up at the Paley Center for Media in Los Angeles.

The free exhibit will run from January 9 through January 20, and is based on the Drunk History web series where host Derek Waters, along with a changing cast of actors and comedians, travel across the country to present the rich tales of our nation.
